Dear Parents and Community Members,

Tillamook Junior High School is a 7th and 8th grade junior high located in Tillamook, OR. We serve over 330 students each day. We have an amazing teaching staff that works hard for all of their students. In our continuing Professional Development, we will focus on Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) and using Trauma-Informed practices. This will have a huge impact on our ability to serve kids and families. The 2016-17 school year was the third year our students participated in SMARTER Balanced Assessments. This yearly assessment is given to students throughout the state who are in grades 3-8 and 11. Over 99% of the students in 7th and 8th grades took the SMARTER Balanced Assessment at Tillamook Junior High. Our bright spots included a large jump in our Science scores, English/Language Arts (ELA) and Math gains for 7th grade English Language Learners and ELA improvement for 8th grade students facing Poverty.

While we are proud of the hard work that students and staff have done, we acknowledge that there is still a lot of work to be done. This year, we will continue our focus on reading, writing, math, and science instruction. We are also implementing the Discovery program school-wide to help kids succeed in the classroom. Finally, we will continue to provide interventions, such as Access Tuesday through Thursday afternoons, for students who need additional academic support. We are committed to helping each child succeed academically and socially. You can help us with this goal by asking questions about your child's homework, monitoring their grades and assignments on ParentVue, making sure they are getting enough sleep, encouraging them to be involved in school activities, and by attending parent-teacher conferences. We look forward to partnering with you this school year!

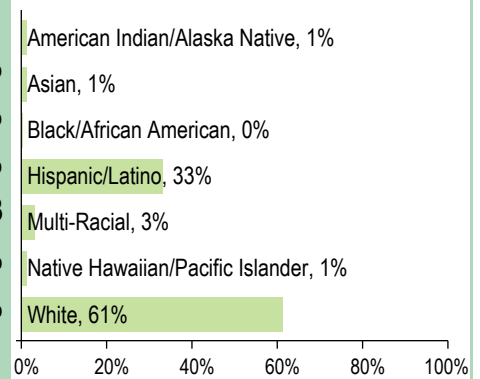
