FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

Because we are a K-1 building we do not participate in state assessments here at Liberty. We do however conduct our own reading, math, and writing assessments regularly. These assessments are aligned with grade level expectations for the Common Core State Standards. Results drive all instructional decisions. In 2016-2017 over 60% of kinder and first grade students met the reading benchmark. The implementation of all-day kindergarten has had a significant impact on the performance of all students especially in the area of reading. We are confident that the implementation of all day pre-school (currently for 20 students) will also address some of the lower numbers we have recently had. Students performing below

benchmark receive interventions both during the school day as well as in the after school program. Students needing English Language Development also receive services during and after school. All curriculums are aligned with the Common Core and are mapped out to ensure that all students are taught with the same curriculum at the same time. Our hope is to give kids a strong start at the beginning of a long and successful academic career. As always thanks for sharing them with us!!

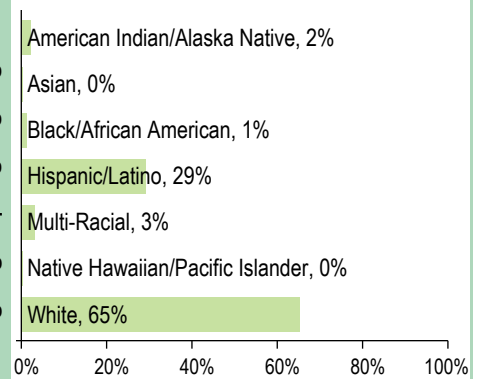

English Language Arts (Administered statewide in grades: 3-8, 11)

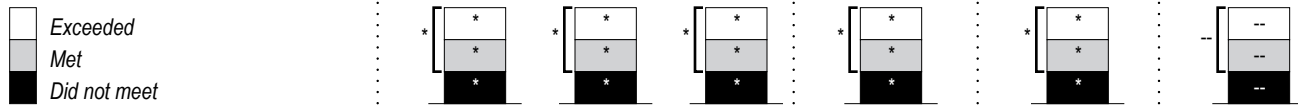


Mathematics (Administered statewide in grades: 3-8, 11)
