

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

East School is a 4th, 5th, and 6th grade elementary school located in Tillamook, OR. We are a school-wide Title I building serving nearly 518 students each day. 64% of our population identifies as white, 30% are Hispanic, and 2% are multi-racial. 63% of our students are economically disadvantaged, 21% of our students are English Language Learners, and 11% of our students are identified as having learning or behavioral disabilities. 98% of our students have all required vaccinations.

The 2015-16 school year was the second year our students participated in SMARTER Balanced Assessments. This assessment is given to students throughout the state who are in grades 3-12. Our results show that we made growth from the year before in both reading and in math.

While we are proud of the hard work that students and staff have done, we acknowledge that there is still a lot of work to be accomplished. This year, we will continue our focus on reading, math, and writing instruction. Our teachers are receiving high-quality professional development in order to provide top-notch instruction for our students. And, we will continue to provide interventions for students who need additional support in academic and social areas. We are committed to helping each child succeed academically and socially. You can help us with that by monitoring your child's homework, reading with your child, attending parent-teacher conferences, and volunteering in the school. We look forward to partnering with you again this school year.

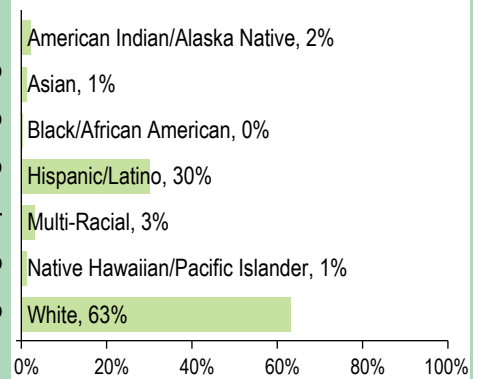

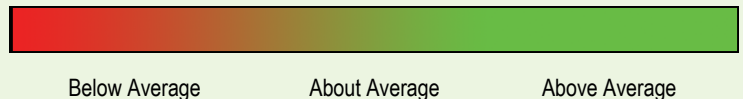
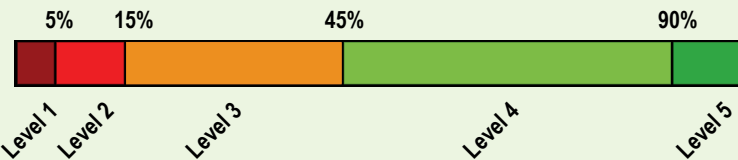
