

## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

It's a great day to be a Cheesemaker!

Tillamook High School is committed to helping each of our students in three distinctive ways:

**Attendance:** Every student will be in school every day, on-time and ready to learn.

**Graduation:** Every student will graduate from high school.

**Have a Plan:** Every graduating student will leave THS with a plan for life after graduation.

During the coming year we are emphasizing opportunities for increased connections between students and significant adults. This is happening through our home rooms (Cheese Blocks), staff training on working with students with Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE's), and home visitations. We will continue our partnership with Tillamook Bay Community College to ensure each student is College and Career Ready (C2R). Students will continue to develop their Personal Education Plan (PEP) as they map out their course through and beyond graduation. Cheesemaker Pride continues to grow

as our educational team works together to develop champion student-athletes that win with class, both in the classroom and on the field of play.

Some highlights from 2015-2016 are:

- At 82%, our graduation rate is eight percentage points better than the state.
- At 85%, our Latino graduation rate is seventeen percentage points higher than the rest of the state of Oregon.
- At 4.1%, our drop-out rate is slightly lower than the state average of other high schools in Oregon.
- At 74%, our students were four points above state average in English Language Arts as measured by the Smarter Balance state assessment.

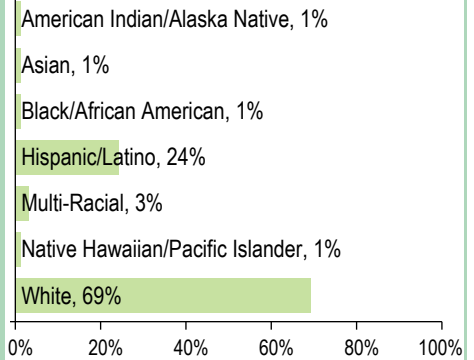

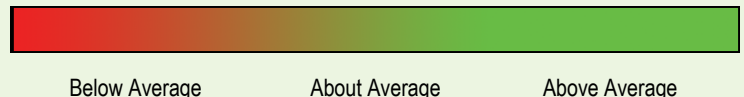
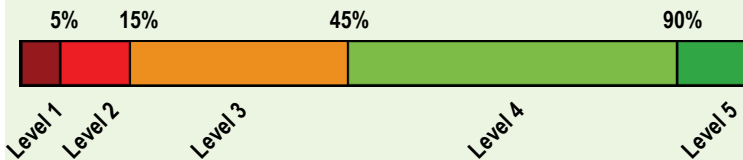
