

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

Tillamook Junior High School is a 7th and 8th grade junior high located in Tillamook, OR. We serve over 325 students each day. 65% of our population identifies as white, 29% are Hispanic, and 3% are multi-racial. 59% of our students are economically disadvantaged, 20% of our students are English Language Learners, and 13% of our students are identified as having learning or behavioral disabilities. 78% of our students have all required vaccinations.

The 2015-16 school year was the second year our students participated in SMARTER Balanced Assessments. This assessment is given to students throughout the state who are in grades 3-8 and 11. Over 95% of the students in 7th and 8th grades took the SMARTER Balanced Assessment at Tillamook Junior High. Our results show that 75% of our students met or nearly met in Language Arts, 70% of students met or nearly met in math, and 47% met or nearly met in science.

While we are proud of the hard work that students and staff have done, we acknowledge that there is still a lot of work to be accomplished. This year, we will continue our focus on reading, writing, math, and science instruction. Our teachers are receiving high-quality professional development in order to provide top-notch instruction for our students. And, we will continue to provide interventions (such as Access and Discovery) for students who need additional support.

We are committed to helping each child succeed academically and socially. You can help us with that by asking questions about your child's homework, monitoring their grades on ParentVue, making sure they are getting enough sleep, encouraging them to be involved in school activities, and by attending parent-teacher conferences.

We look forward to partnering with you this school year!

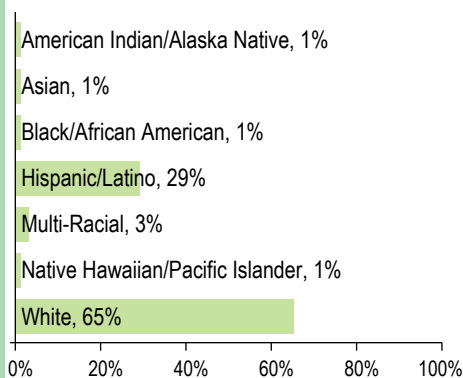

Percent of students without all required vaccines: 22

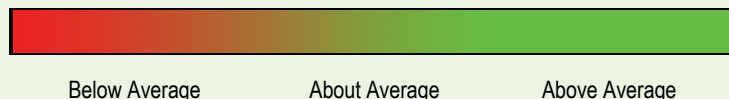
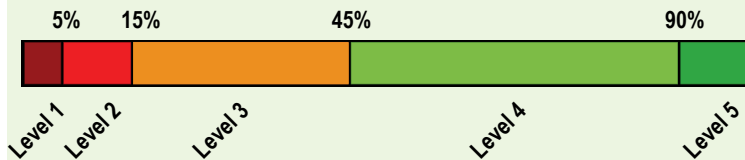
